NARRATIVE

On April 8, 2022, I responded to 400 Sunny Isles Blvd in reference to a burglary to a vehicle. Upon arrival I met with [REDACTED] (victim), who stated the following:

James valeted his 2022 black Toyota Camry bearing FL tag HDRQ98 at approximately 9:18pm on April 7, 2022. When his vehicle was brought to him from the valet lot on today's date, several items were missing from the vehicle. Missing were sunglasses, shoes, cologne, and a pair of Apple AirPods. The total value of the items missing is approximately \$2,380.00. James stated there were no damage outside or inside to the vehicle. James completed a stolen property affidavit and then cleared the scene.

I then spoke with Luis from valet who stated the vehicle was parked in space 2014B. He stated valet locks the vehicle however, they also leave the keys on the tire of the vehicles for quick access to it. I then met with the assistant property manager Jeff Jean-Pierre (involved other), in order to review surveillance footage. As Luis, Jeff, and I were reviewing surveillance footage from a terminal in the parking garage, we were approached by Bryan Hall (victim-2), who stated his vehicle was broken into last night.

Hall is the owner of a 2021 black Range Rover sport bearing FL tag L7BIW. Hall stated his vehicle was valeted at approximately 7:00pm on April 7, 2022. He stated he got his vehicle this morning and went to the gym. He then returned back to 400 SIB BLVD. It was here that he realized several pieces of golf equipment totaling approximately \$5,850.00 was missing from his car. He stated he was sure the equipment was not stolen while he was at the gym as his vehicle was locked and must have occurred the previous night. Hall then completed a stolen property affidavit. There was also no damage to the outside or inside of his vehicle.

I then spoke with Luis from valet again and he stated valet has a spare key to Hall's vehicle and is instructed to lock his vehicle at night, due to it being previously stolen. Luis stated its possible the valet attendant who parked Hall's vehicle may not have locked the car.

A review of surveillance footage shows an unknown male driving a white Mazda CX-9 bearing FL tag 08AWBQ driving on the various levels of the parking garage. The male appears to stop in front of various vehicles in the parking garage and get out and appear to inspect to see if they are unlocked. At 10:54pm camera CH 1 shows the male stop in front of the parking space where James's vehicle was parked. The male then disappears off camera for several minutes. Due to the angle of the camera, it is not known what the male was doing. Camera CH 4 also shows the male park in front of a motorcycle to also inspect it.

While reviewing this footage in the parking garage, we were approached by Luis Felip Placides and another valet employee. He stated he wished to report the key to his Mazda CX-9 was missing. He confirmed the Mazda that we were currently seeing on the screen was his, however he was not operating the car. He stated he did not give permission anyone permission to operate the vehicle. Jeff stated he would email me the surveillance clips with the male, and attempt to further locate more videos to determine how the male entered into the parking garage. A case card was provided to all parties. No further police action taken.

I started my follow-up Burglary to a Conveyance/ Grand Theft Investigation on April 10, 2022. This case (22-00890) involves two vehicles and two victim`s. Both cars were burglarized at 400 Sunny Isles Boulevard between 04/07/22 at 2254 hours through 04/08/22 at 1010 hours. At the time I initiated my follow-up Investigation, the initial reports written by Officer B. Bestard, (0157) were pending approval. The initial reports were written on 4/8/22.

VEHICLE #1 2022 TOYOTA CAMRY: VICTIM, [REDACTED]

I contacted Mr. James by phone and we spoke about the case. Mr. James related that he valet parked his Camry on April 7, 2022 at approximately 2118 hours and spent the evening at his girlfriends residence in the building. On 4/8/22 at approximately 1010 hours valet brought his vehicle to him and he noticed several items were missing from his vehicle such as Apple Airpods, sunglasses an shoes and cologne valued at approximately \$2,380.00. During Officer Bestard`s initial Investigation, he learned from Valet employee that the valet who parked the Camry locked the vehicle and left the keys on the tire for " quick access." The Camry was parked in space # 2014B.

VEHICLE #2 2019 RANGE ROVER SPORT: [REDACTED]

I called Mr. Hall, [REDACTED] and left a voice mail message for him to call me. Officer Bestard was approached by Mr. Hall, while he was on scene Investigating the Camry burglary. Mr. Hall valet parked his 2019 Range Rover on April 7, 2022 at approximately 1900 hours. The next morning, (4/8/22) after 0800 he found that his vehicle had been burglarized and over \$5,850.00 of golf equipment was stolen from the vehicle while parked at 400 Sunny Isles Blvd. Officer Bestard determined that the building valet had a spare key to the vehicle and may not have locked the vehicle.

INVESTIGATION

On April 10, 2022 I was able to obtain building CCTV from Security Supervisor Warnesha Williams, [REDACTED] On April 7, 2022, building CCTV captures a U-Haul van enter the exit gate of the building at approximately 2139 hours. The tag is an Arizona tag AL09906. A white male offender is captured on CCTV walking through various floors of the building looking into cars. The male appears to be 25-35 years of age, he has a black sleeveless shirt on black long shorts, black high socks and white slide shoes. The male has a short close-crop hairstyle and dark sunglasses. The male has a large tattoo on the upper part of his left arm. At one point in the video, the male is carrying/wearing a green shirt. The male appears to be 5`10"- 6`00" and 18-220 pounds. It appears he is carrying a black ballcap. At one point the male is standing next to the burglarized 2022 Toyota Camry. The CCTV does not capture the burglary due to the positioning of the CCTV.

A Need to identify was circulated to ALL Sworn with the image of the offender

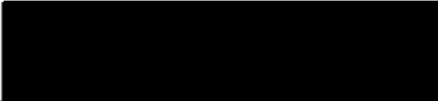

The Arizona tag is registered to the U-Haul Corporation. On April 10, 2022, I sent an email to U-Haul Corporate Security, (Angela_willingham@uhaul.com) requesting renter information on that vehicle from April 7, 2022.

APRIL 11, 2022

On April 11, 2022 I received a response from Angela Willingham, Investigator at U-Haul. The subject vehicle was rented by [REDACTED] (NY Drivers License # [REDACTED]) (suspended). Phone number [REDACTED] is listed on the rental contract. Email address listed is [REDACTED]. The vehicle was rented on 2/21/22 and was due back the next day. The vehicle was rented at U-Haul, 1120 NE 48 Street, Pompanoe Beach, FL, 954-580-3273. According to U-Haul, they wish to report the vehicle stolen. The NY Drivers License photograph does not match the offender captured on CCTV.

APRIL 13, 2022

On April 13, 2022, the subject vehicle, the U-Haul Van (2021 GMC Savannah Van Arizona Tag AL09906) was reported stolen to BSO by U-Haul. The date of theft is 3/30/22. The subject is listed as the renter, [REDACTED]. The BSO case is 11-2204-004082. The vehicle has a BSO hold for latents.

Attempts to contact Mr. Grasso have been met with negative results. I have issued Need to Identify Flyers throughout Miami-Dade and Broward County.

At this time, there are no investigative leads, the case will be classified as PENDING INACTIVE.

Later in the day on April 8, 2022 I responded back to 400 Sunny Isles and met with the property manager Jeff Jean-Pierre. He stated he reviewed surveillance footage of the offender of both this case number as well as 22-00892 entering onto the property. The footage shows the male attempt to enter the entrance into the parking garage at approximately 9:26 pm on April 7, 2022. The subject is operating a 2021 U-Haul GMC Savana van bearing AZ tag AL09906.

The male goes around the gate arm but gets the van stuck due to the rolling gate blocking the entrance. After being stuck in between the gate arm and the actual rolling gate, a resident from the building arrives. The building gate operates off of an automatic reader that all resident vehicles are equipped with. Once the resident's vehicle got close to the entrance, the rolling gate automatically opened and allowed the offender to drive his vehicle in. The offender then parked the U-Haul van on the second floor and exits.

The offender is a white hispanic male with a large tattoo on his left shoulder. The male then proceeds to walk throughout the parking garage, and changes his shirt from black to green. He is the same male who was identified operating the victim's white Mazda CX-9 (Sunny Isles Beach case #22-00892). The male appears to use the victim's Mazda and drive up to Hall and James's vehicles and place their property inside of the Mazda. The offender then drives the Mazda and parks next to the U-Haul van and remains parked for several minutes; to possibly place the stolen property inside of the van. The male then returns the Mazda to its original parking place and walks back to the U-Haul van where he drives out of the garage.

Jean-Pierre stated he would try to email me the video evidence to my department email. I then cleared the scene.

FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION

April 29, 2022

On April 26, 2022, Channel 10, (WPLG) featured a news story on these residential burglaries in Sunny Isles Beach and posted a video I provided which was obtained from 400 Sunny Isles Boulevard concerning case(s) 22-00890, 22-00892, 22-00897 which are burglaries to a conveyance/grand theft auto.

The video captures the subject vehicle, a GMC U-Haul unlawfully entering the out gate at a private residence called 400 Sunny Isles Boulevard. Subsequently, the video captures a male offender operate a vehicle which he had stolen on the property and burglarize other vehicles at that location. Channel 10 posted a section of the video showing the offender within the property for the purpose of having the public identify the offender.

On April 29, 2022, Sunny Isles Beach Lieutenant M. Mulvey received a Crime Stoppers tip concerning the Channel 10 news clip/video. The tipster advised "the suspect on the Channel 10 article with the U-Haul is Robert [REDACTED]"

Utilizing investigative tools, I was able to find a DAVID (State of Florida Driver and Vehicle Information Database) photograph of Robert [REDACTED] (S432-773-76-068-0). The address listed on the [REDACTED]

Through investigation I was able to speak to a known associate of Sledzaus, a [REDACTED] presented Mrs. Strauss with the video obtained from 400 Sunny Isles boulevard and she advised that she has not seen Sledzaus in two years but it looks similar to him and he has tattoos on his upper arms (which the CCTV captures).

Utilizing the Florida Department of Corrections Inmate Release database, (out of custody 08/01/2016) (FDLE # 03804350) I was able to learn that Sledzaus has the following Tattoo`s; (1) left arm (cross H MM) (2) right arm, (6 of Diamond card, and (RS Money) also on right arm.

Mrs. Strauss was reluctant to positively identify Sledzaus and commented "he has been in prison and is dangerous and I am afraid."

The case is clasified as PENDING ACTIVE.

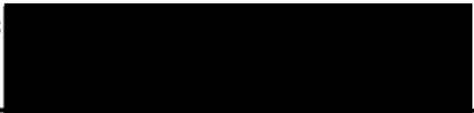

NARRATIVE

While investigating a burglary to a vehicle at 400 Sunny Isles (Sunny Isles Beach case #22-00890), I was approached by [REDACTED] Sanchez (victim), who stated the key fob to his vehicle was missing. He stated he was the owner of a 2019 white Mazda CX-9 bearing FL tag [REDACTED]. He stated he had valeted his vehicle at approximately 9:30am on April 7, 2022 with the building. He stated when he requested to get his vehicle this morning, valet informed him the key fob was not with the vehicle and could not be moved.

At the time Sanchez approached me I was reviewing surveillance footage regarding the vehicle burglary under the above case number. The video showed an unknown male driving a white Mazda CX-9 and approaching different cars. Sanchez identified the vehicle as his. After looking at the security footage, we then went to where Sanchez's vehicle was parked. Luis from valet confirmed the vehicle was parked differently then when valet had parked it.

I then requested Evidence Technician D. Varone respond to process the vehicle. Varone then responded and processed the vehicle (See Varone supplement report for more information). Sanchez then completed a Stolen Vehicle Affidavit.

Property Manager Jeff Jean-Pierre stated he would review surveillance footage further and contact me when video was located. See case #22-00890 for more information.

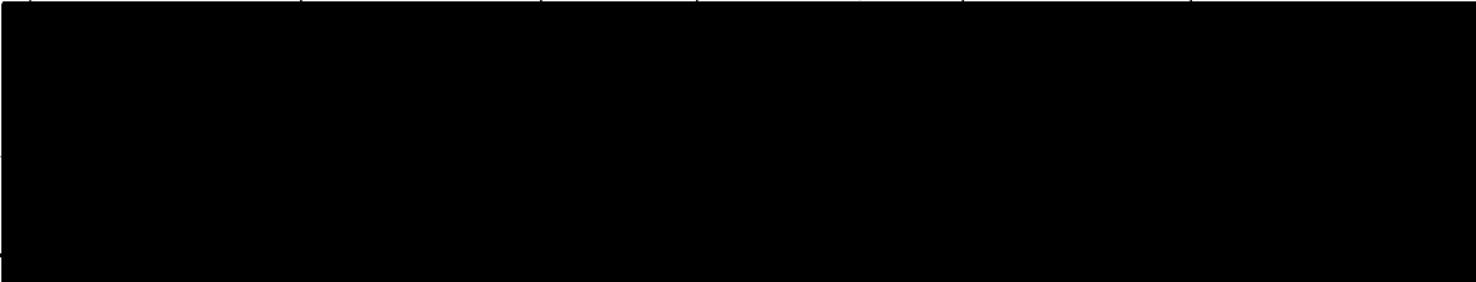

I started my follow-up Grand Theft of a Conveyance Investigation on April 10, 2022. This case (22-00892) involves a 2019 Mazda CX-9 that was entered and driven without the express knowledge and permission of the registered owner.

At the time I initiated my follow-up Investigation, the initial report written by Officer B. Bestard, (0157) were pending approval. The initial report were written on 4/8/22.

I contacted the victim by phone and his wife, Jennifer Blandon translated and we spoke about the case. The victim related that he valet parked his Mazda CX-9 on April 7, 2022 at approximately 0930 hours and left valet with the key.

INVESTIGATION

On 4/8/22 at approximately 1156 the victim went to valet and asked valet to bring his vehicle down. Valet advised the victim his keys were missing from his vehicle. It would appear that the keys were left on a tire with the vehicle. Utilizing the Florida Department of Corrections Inmate Release database, (out of custody 08/01/2016) (FDLE # 03804350) I was able to learn that Sledzaus has the following Tattoo's; (1) left arm (cross H MM) (2) right arm, (6 of Diamond card, and (RS Money) also on right arm.

Mrs. Strauss was reluctant to positively identify Sledzaus and commented "he has been in prison and is dangerous and I am afraid."

FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION

April 29, 2022

On April 26, 2022, Channel 10, (WPLG) featured a news story on these residential burglaries in Sunny Isles Beach and posted a video I provided which was obtained from 400 Sunny Isles Boulevard concerning case(s) 22-00890, 22-00892, 22-00897 which are burglaries to a conveyance/grand theft auto.

The video captures the subject vehicle, a GMC U-Haul unlawfully entering the out gate at a private residence called 400 Sunny Isles Boulevard. Subsequently, the video captures a male offender operate a vehicle which he had stolen on the property and burglarize other vehicles at that location. Channel 10 posted a section of the video showing the offender within the property for the purpose of having the public identify the offender.

On April 29, 2022, Sunny Isles Beach Lieutenant M. Mulvey received a Crime Stoppers tip concerning the Channel 10 news clip/video. The tipster advised "the suspect on the Channel 10 article with the U-Haul is Robert Mark Sledzaus."



Mrs. Strauss was reluctant to positively identify Sledzaus and commented "he has been in prison and is dangerous and I am afraid."
